

BOG-27/11/1: To confirm the minutes of the 26th Meeting of the Board.

Complex and ancillary works for Rs. 42.00 Crores.

BOG-27/11/6: To consider according approval of proposal and preliminary estimate of the proposed phase-wise planning for infrastructure

development of the Institute.

The Board after threadbare discussion has approved in principle the concept plan for phase-wise construction of different projects asdetailed in the table under this agenda item. The Board further resolved that the Institute will take project wise administrative approval of the BOG for construction of different projects detailed in the concept plan.

The Board further resolved that the area proposed for the Central Library needs to be reviewed keeping in view the development of Information and Communication technology.

To take note of the recent unwarranted incident that took place in the campus consequent upon the suicide committed by a 4<sup>th</sup> Sem. student of ECE deptt.

The matter regarding non-conducting of Summer Term Courses (except 8th Sem.) during the Summer Vacation of 2011.

During discussion of the said item, the Dean (Acd) was called in to apprise the Board about his plan to take up the forthcoming academic activities. The Dean(Acd) explained to the Board in details about the proposed academic calendar for the ensuing exams. and other academic activities. The Board resolved that the proposed academic calendar may be first placed before the Senate scheduled to be held on 24th June'11.

During discussion, the Board further resolved that the next Convocation date may fixed either on  $28^{th}$  ,  $29^{th}$  or  $30^{th}$  July'11 and Prof. Samir K. Brahmachari (Director General, C.S.I.R.) may be requested to grace the Convocation as Chief Guest.

BOG-27/11/10 (A): To consider the concept of Green Building under GRIHA Rating System with atleast 3-star rating to all upcoming buildings.

> As per the discussion the Director held with the Chairman, this matter was placed before the Board as an additional item.

> After threadbare discussion on the contents of the letter dt.  $6^{th}$ June'11, received from the Secretary, Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, Govt. of India, the Board felt that since the NIT Silchar does not have minimum infrastructure, incorporating the GRIHA provisions will increase the cost. The Fund available from MHRD is not enough to address the requirement of minimum infrastructure. However, the concepts of GRIHA wherever possible without escalation may be implemented.
