S-74/22/03: To take a decision on 6 months Physical Internship by the UG students in the 8th semester

The FIC (T&P) have submitted a proposal for the provision of 6 months Onsite Internship by the UG students. The copy of the proposal is appended at Annexure-III.

In this regard, the Dean (Academic) called a meeting of all Heads on 12.09.2022 and the resolution adopted in the said meeting is enumerated below.

Option 1) A summer term course may be conducted after the completion of 3rd year i.e. 6th semester for the students who are willing to undergo internship in Physical Mode to other Organisation/Agency in the 8th semester. In the said summer term course interested students having CGPA not less than 8.5 or top 20 percentile in the department level, may be allowed to take up & complete their 8th semester subjects, except 8th sem project. Students who will complete their 8th semester theory & practical subjects in the summer term course may be allowed to avail the internship in Physical Mode to other Organisation/Agency in the 8th semester provided they do not have any backlog and fulfil the academic requirements, if any. Students have to complete the 8th semester project during the internship.

Option 2) It is observed that there are 04 subjects (03 theory + 01 project) in the 8th semester. For availing the internship in Physical Mode to other Organisation/Agency in the 8th semester, students may be allowed to take up the 03 nos, theory subjects of the 8th semester in the even semesters during 4th / 6th semester as extra load regular subjects. Students who can complete the entire UG curriculum before the 8th semester except project may be allowed to undergo internship in Physical Mode to other Organisation/Agency in the 8th semester. Students have to complete the 8th semester project during the internship.

Copy of the said resolution is also appended at Annexure-IV.

The Senate is requested to deliberate and take a decision in this regard.

Decision:

The Senate after detailed deliberation on the matter, resolved the following.

- a. B.Tech students in 7th semester without any active backlogs till the 6th semester will be allowed for 6 months onsite/offline internship program offered by companies listed in FORTUNE500/NIFTY50. Henceforth, these students will be addressed as "the selected students".
- b. The selected students for this onsite/offline internship have to register for the 8th semester courses at NIT Silchar and have to appear for mid semester and end semester examinations through offline mode at NIT Silchar along with other students. Further, in lieu of their 20 marks sessional assessment, they have to register for corresponding online courses from NPTEL/MOOC/Coursera/Swayam/any other recognized online platform at their own expense. These courses must be approved by

the DUPC of the Department. These selected students can also register for any of their 8th semester courses which are going to be offered by the faculty members of NIT Silchar in hybrid mode (in this case, they do not require to register for online courses from NPTEL/MOOC/Coursera/Swayam platform for 20 marks Sessional assessment).

c. Further, the selected students have to go through the all assessments part of the NPTEL/MOOC/Coursera/Swayam/any other recognized online platform and need to submit their grading to the respective faculty members. The DUPC of the respective departments will finalize the modalities of converting the acquired grading by the students to 20 marks.

d. Moreover, the selected students have to complete their 8th semester B. Tech projects successfully in consultation with their respective faculty advisors.

> Sri Amiya Dey, Regn. No. 16304102, was a Ph.D. student of NIT Meghalaya and was allowed to transfer his admission to NIT Silchar as per request of his supervisor (Dr. Arnab Nandi). He was admitted as a regular (Group A) student. Brief particulars of the student are as follows:

The reports of his thesis examiners were sent to the Supervisor on 23.08.2019 for sharing the relevant portions of the reports with the student for necessary follow up action by the student as well as by the Doctoral Committee subsequently. As no response was received for a long period, the Dean (R&C) wrote an email to Amiya Dey on 19.10.2020 about non-receipt of documents/recommendations of the Doctoral Committee and advised him to be in touch with the Supervisor/Chairman, DC/HOD in this regard.

Clause no 7.1(h) of the Regulations for Ph. D reads as under:

"Once the evaluation reports are favourable, the Defence should be conducted within 06 months from the date of issue of forwarding letter containing "Examiner's Reports on PhD Thesis" by the Dean (RC) to the Supervisor / Head of the Department. In case, the student is unable to appear the Defence within 06 months, he/she has to apply to Dean (R & C) with proper justification. The application should be recommended by the DC and Chairman, DPMC."

The stipulated period of 6 (six) months for conduct of Defence Examination is already over on 23.02.2020. However, the Office of the Dean (RC) has not received any application from the student seeking extension of time beyond 6 months for Defence Examination. The issue has thus become long pending without any likely outcome.

The matter is placed before the Senate for consideration and direction.

Decision:

The Senate discussed the matter at length and decided to seek opinion of the concerned Supervisor. Consequent upon this, the matter be placed in the next meeting of the Senate.

S-74/22/12: To consider transfer of the Course Work Credits from Group-B registration to Group-A registration in respect of Nilotpal Goswami, Ph.D. student in Chemistry Department

Sri Nilotpal Goswami, Regn.No-22307004, took admission as a Group-A Ph.D. student in the Department of Chemistry during July-December, 2022 session. Earlier in 2021, he was admitted as a Group-B Ph.D. student in the same department with Registration No. 21307031 and he successfully completed his Course work. Accordingly, the current Doctoral Committee has recommended for transfer of the course work credits in his previous Group-B registration to the current Group-A registration. Copy of the report of the Doctoral Committee is attached (Annexure-XII).

The matter is placed before the Senate for consideration and decision.

Decision:

The Senate agreed to transfer the credits earned during Group-B admission to Group-A admission in 2022 for Sri Nilotpal Goswami (22307004). Dean (RC) also discussed similar cases and the Senate advised that with the recommendation of the DC & DPMC, transfer of credit from Group-B admission to Group-A admission be considered for such cases with the approval of the Chairman Senate.

S-74/22/13: To consider revision of mandatory publication requirement for Ph.D. thesis

Currently, the mandatory publication requirement for a Ph.D. thesis to be allowed to submit is one SCI/SSCI/Scopus indexed journal publication. However, over the years the research activity of the Institute has increased in terms of quality as well as quantity. Enhanced research activity leading to increased publication has contributed

a lot in improving its ranking. To sustain quality research, it is proposed that the following may be the mandatory publications for submission of Ph.D. theses:

- Two SCIE/SSCI indexed journal publications
- Two conference proceedings.

The Senate may consider and take a suitable decision.

Decision:

The Senate discussed the matter at length and decided that the following shall be mandatory publication requirement for submission of Ph.D. thesis with effect from January 2023 entry batch:

- Two SCIE/SSCI/Scopus indexed journal publications
- One conference proceedings.

S-74/22/14: To consider scrutiny and screening committee for project staff recruitment

As of now, no specified committee is there to scrutinize and screen the applications for appointment as project staff. As a practice, the concerned Head constitutes a committee for this purpose. As such, it is proposed that the following committee, constituted by the concerned Head, may be authorized to do this job:

- a). Concerned Head of the Dept: Chairperson
- Subject expert(s) (to be nominated by the concerned Head in consultation with the PI); member
- c). Project Investigator: member

The Dean (RC) may be authorised to approve the scrutinized and screened list.

The Senate may consider and take a decision.

Decision:

The matter is administrative in nature and the Senate advised to do the needful accordingly.

S-74/22/15: To consider evaluation committee for extension of services of project staff

As per norm for extension of service period of project staff, his/her performance needs to be evaluated. If it is satisfactory, his/her tenure in extended by a maximum of 1 year at a time on approval by the Director. However, our guidelines has not specified any specific committee for this purpose. Presently, a committee constituted by the concerned Head, which also includes PI, evaluates the performance. As such, it is proposed that the following committee, constituted by the concerned Head, may be authorized to do this job:

- a). Concerned Head of the Dept: Chairperson
- Subject expert(s) (to be nominated by the concerned Head in consultation with the PI): member
- c). Project Investigator: member

Extension upto a maximum of 1 year or rest over period of the project, whichever is less, at a time may be granted by the Director, on recommendation of the committee and Dean (RC).

The Senate may consider and take a decision.



Decision:

The matter is administrative in nature and the Senate advised to do the needful accordingly.

S-74/22/16: To consider special provision for Ph.D. admission by project staff

An otherwise eligible and recommended project staff is allowed to take admission into Ph.D. program, provided a minimum of 1 year duration is left over for the given project. Thus, if a staff joins immediately after the completion of the admission process, he/she has to wait for the next round of admission process to start. In this process, he/she loses some time and may not get an opportunity due to the project time constraints. Usually, people are less interested to work in a project and we need to make multiple advertisements for project staff recruitment. However, an immediate opportunity for admission into Ph.D. program may act as an incentive for this job. In view of this, it is proposed to authorize the selection committees, constituted for project staff recruitment, to make additional recommendation for Ph.D. admission as well, if the candidate is eligible and found suitable. If recommended and approved by the Chairman, Senate, he/she may be allowed to take admission in the Ph.D. program without going through the regular admission process. Furthermore, such candidates may be allowed to take admission at any point of time, even though the Ph.D. regulations states that a candidate can apply for admission in the prescribed form round the year. However, the admission shall be offered twice in a year - during January to June and July to December sessions only. In this regard, a modified recommendation form is enclosed (Annexure-XIII) for kind perusal and consideration.

The Senate may consider and take a decision.

Decision:

In principle the Senate agreed with the proposal, However, two separate recommendations (one for recruitment and the other for Ph.D. admission) be made by the selection committee. The recommendation for recruitment is to be submitted to Dean (RC) as usual and the recommendation Ph.D. admission is to be submitted to the concerned DPMC. The DPMC shall make the final recommendation to the Dean (RC) for Ph.D. admission. The provision for Ph.D. admission is to be indicated in the advertisement for project staff selection. The interested candidates are required to fill up the Ph.D. admission form as well. In case, the recruitment is made by the project sanctioning authority, the Dean (RC) shall do the needful for Ph.D. admission in consultation with Chairman, Senate / Director immediately after joining of the project staff, provided he/she is interested for the same.

S-74/22/17: To decide on registration category of part-time students consequent upon resignation from C-DAC

Admin Officer, C-DAC, Silchar vide an email dated 31.7.2022, intimated that the following C-DAC employees, who were admitted to Ph.D. program as part-time students, have been relieved from C-DAC on resignation.

For admission as a part-time student, one must be an employee of a State/Central Govt. Departments/PSUs/Reputed Educational Institutes/Research

organizations/Reputed Industries/Faculty under TEQIP III at the time of admission having at least one year experience in the discipline in which admission is sought. A No Objection Certificate from the Head of the Institute/Organization, in which he/she is employed, must be enclosed with application in prescribed form. These students were admitted based on the NOC issued by C-DAC.

As they are no longer the employees of C-DAC, a decision is solicited whether they can be allowed to continue as a part-time student. No information has been received from the students about their present employment, if any.

The Senate may consider the matter and take a decision.

Decision:

The Senate discussed the matter and resolved that the students need to submit fresh NOCs, if they are still employed elsewhere, for continuation as part-time students. If he/she is not currently employed, his/her admission category be changed to Group B regular, if the student is interested. Otherwise, his/her admission shall be cancelled.

S-74/22/18: To ratify the approval of Chairman, Senate in respect of extension of Ph.D. Program.

Clause 6.12 of the Ph. D. Regulations reads as follows: "The maximum duration of the Ph.D. Program, including all granted leaves, will be 6 years from the date of admission for full-time students and 7 years for part-time students. Unless the Senate otherwise allows, the registration of a student shall stand cancelled automatically after the expiry of stipulated duration".

The following students could not complete their studies within the stipulated periods due to various reasons and applied for extension to complete the Ph.D. program. On the basis of recommendations received from the respective Doctoral Committees (DC), Chairman, Senate has granted extension as listed below:
