# EIGHTY FIRST MEETING OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS MINUTES

The 81st meeting of the Board of Governors was held on 21st April, 2021 at 1700 hours. The following members were present in the meeting:

Sri Gautam N Mehra presided the meeting of the Board of Governors as Chairperson in accordance with Section 16 of the NITSER Act.

At the outset, Prof. N. B. Dev Choudhury welcomed the Chairperson and other members who attended the meeting

The BoG then initiated the discussion on the Agenda Items one by one: -

#### BoG-81/21/01: To confirm the minutes of the 80th Meeting of Board of Governors.

Eightieth meeting of the Board of Governors was held on 15th February, 2021 via video conferencing. The copies of the Minutes of the 80th meeting of the Board of Governors (Annexure - I1) was circulated to all the members of the Board. No comments has been received from any members.

# To consider the proposal for a dual degree programme with Arizona State University.

The Institute has received a proposal for a Dual Degree Program with Arizona State University, USA for undergraduate courses. As per the said proposal, the partnering Institutes will establish a collaborative education program in which qualified undergraduate students after successfully completing the first two (2) years of their curriculum, will apply for admission to selected fields of study at Arizona State University, USA for the next two (2) years to finish a required training curriculum to qualify for their bachelor's degrees awarded by both the partnering Institutes.

The copy of the proposal along with the draft agreement is placed at Annexure –  $V_1$  & Annexure –  $V_2$  respectively.

The Senate considered the proposal for a dual programme with Arizona State University and recommend the same to the BoG for consideration.

The Board is requested to approve the same.

### DECISION

One of the Honourable Board Member of the Institute commented that from the proposal, it is not clear whether the proposed dual degree programme (2+2) with Arizona State University will be two-way process or one-way process and what will be its financial implication for the Institute?

The Institute clarified that only the students of this institute will pursue dual degree programme with Arizona State University and there is no financial involvement of the Institute.

As per Statute 30 (i) of first statute of NIT, a permanent employee before releasing the institute should give three months' notice in writing to his appointing authority or by pay three months salary in lieu thereof. Dr. N. Soren vide letter dated 01.03.2021 requested to release her on lien w.e.f. 01.06.2021 (A/N)

Rule 32 (2) (e) of CCS (Leave) Rules states that twenty-four months, where the leave is required for the purpose of prosecuting studies certified to be in the public interest, provided the Government servant concerned has completed three years' continuous service on the date of expiry of leave of the kind due and admissible under these rules.

Further, as per Rule 32 (3) (a) of CCS (Leave) Rules Where a Government servant is granted extraordinary leave in relaxation of the provisions contained in Clause (e) of sub-rule (2), shall be required to execute a Bond in Form 6 undertaking to refund to the Government the actual amount of expenditure incurred by the Government during such leave plus that incurred by any other agency with interest thereon in the event of his not returning to duty on the expiry of such leave or quitting the service before a period of three years after return to duty.

Dr. R. Khosla has executed a bond in form 6 and was granted Extra Ordinary Leave for 18 months 4 days.

It is to be pointed out that R. Khosla has requested to grant him Extra Ordinary Leave from 01.08.2019 to 02.08.2021 i.e. 24 months 2 days and as per Rule
